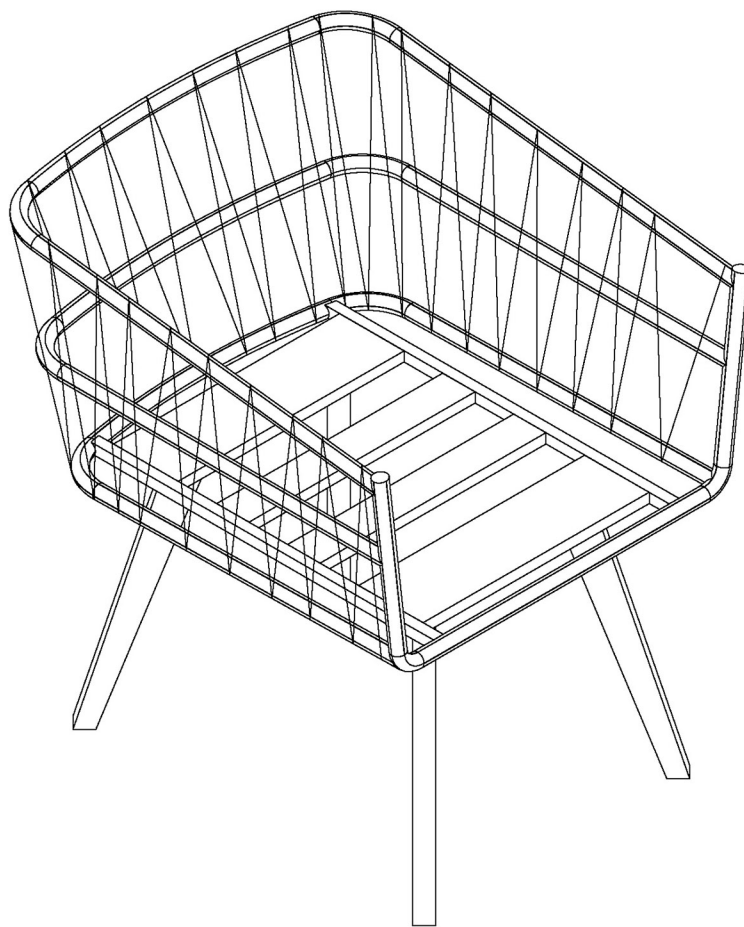

- Avoid sharp objects and corrosive chemicals to prevent damage to the product or bodily injury.

Material Properties

1. Solid Wood

Trees will have a unique texture, scar, color and other natural marks during their growth. These elements constitute the natural beauty of wood. After being made into furniture, there will be slight discoloration when viewed under different light and different angles. That is because different grain minerals and light intensity affect vision, which is a normal phenomenon.

2. Marble and Sintered Stone

The pattern of marble and sintered stone is unique to each piece. Due to the characteristics of the material, there is no guarantee that the pattern of each piece will be consistent with the pattern seen at the time of purchase.

Assembly Instructions

- Read these instructions carefully and keep for future reference. Refer to parts inventory for guidance, and ensure you have all pieces before starting.

- **When assembling place all parts on a soft, clean, and flat surface such as a carpet to prevent scratches.**
- **During assembly, align all screws with the corresponding pre-drilled holes first and then tighten them one by one.**

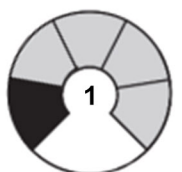

Do not discard any contents until after assembly is complete to avoid accidentally discarding small parts or hardware.

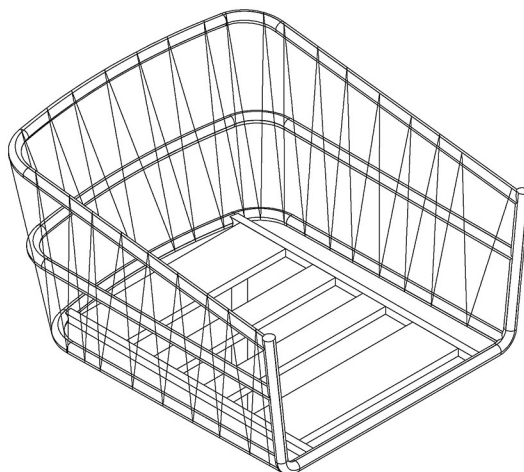

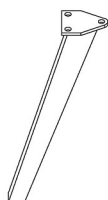

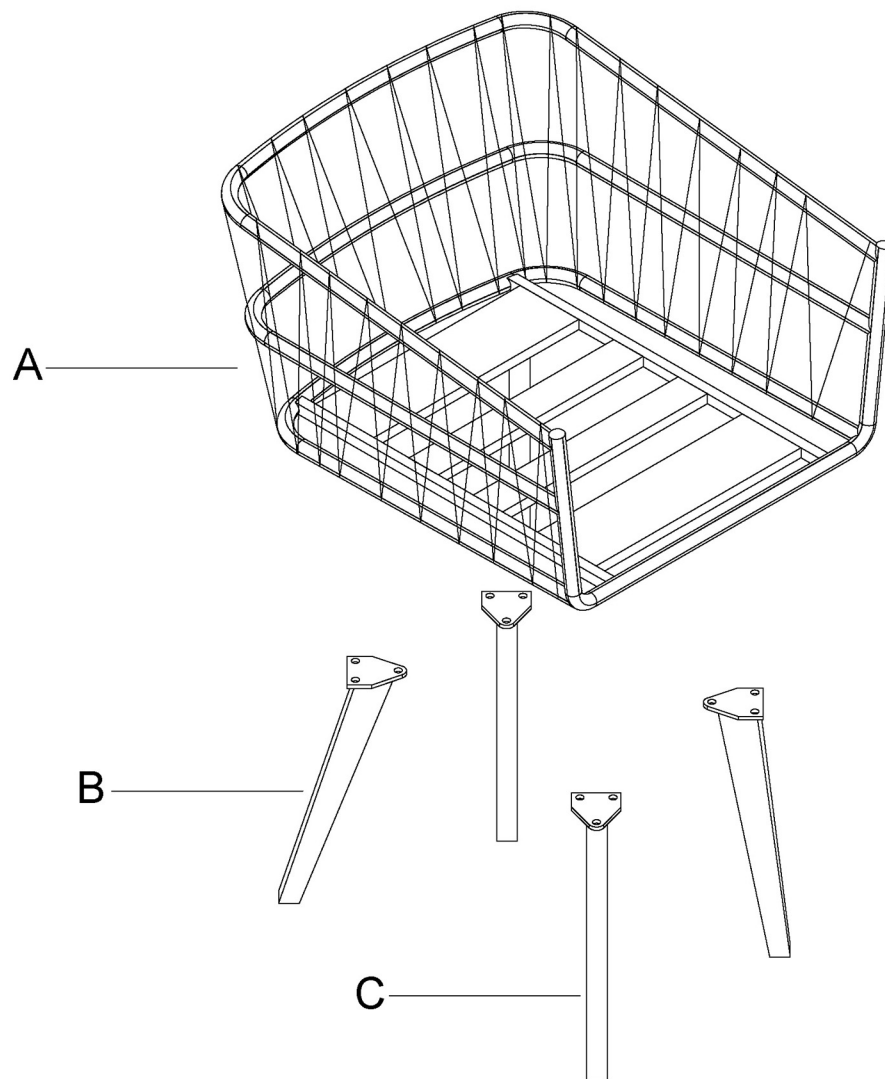

Exploded Views

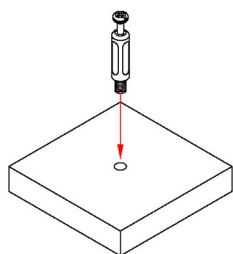

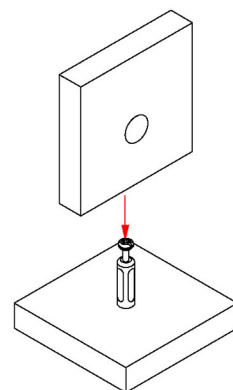
Cam Lock Fastening System Installation



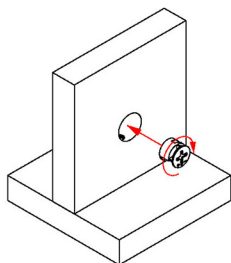
1. Install the screw rod



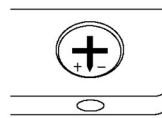
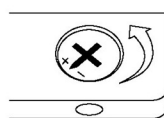
2. Pay attention to tightening the screw rod

5. Pay attention to aligning the arrow of the eccentric part with the screw rod

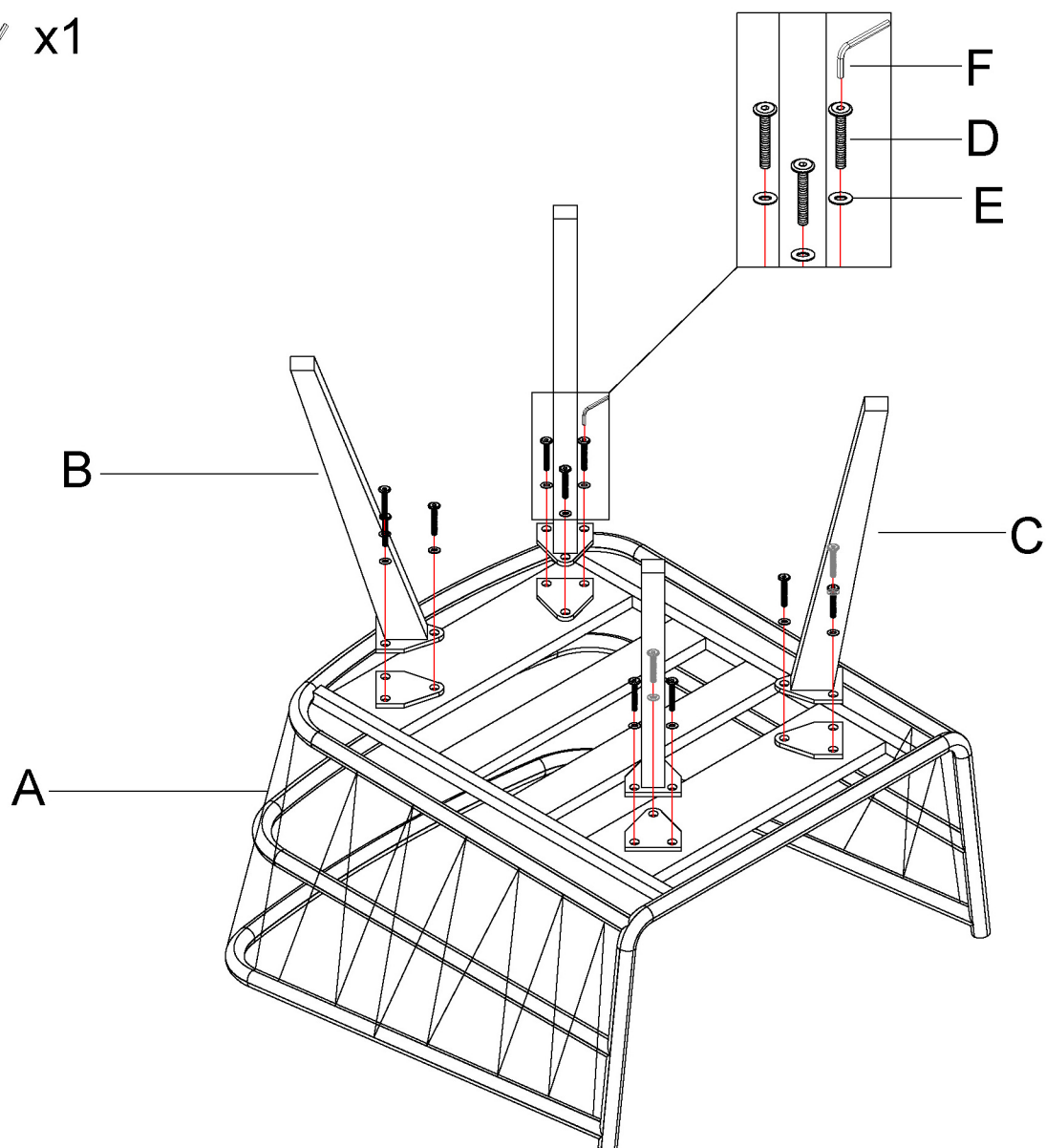

Use & Maintenance

1. Clean your outdoor furniture regularly to remove dirt, dust, and debris. Use a mild detergent and warm water to wash the furniture, and rinse thoroughly. Avoid using abrasive cleaners or materials that may damage the furniture's surface;
2. Teak furniture naturally weathers to a silver or gray patina over time. If you want to prevent your teak furniture from aging to a gray color, use a teak sealer/protector on an annual or bi-annual basis. Ensure that the furniture is clean and dry before applying the sealer.
3. Screws may become loose during long-term use. If necessary, re-tighten them to ensure stability and security.
4. A moist environment creates ideal conditions for mold and mildew growth. If possible, keep cushions or pillows under an umbrella, awning, or pergola. If possible, it's a good idea to store your furniture at the end of the season. If you're unable to store your furniture, make sure you buy covers that are designed to stand up to the rigors of the elements, which is especially vital if you live in a geographic location that receives harsh winters. During rainy days, bring all your cushions inside, they aren't built to weather storms. In case the cushion gets wet, make sure you let it fully dry before using it again.
