

#### **Before Installation**


- 1. Please read these instructions before assembling or installing the product. **NOTE**: Installation by a licensed electrian is recommended.
- 2. Take out the fixture and the mounting package and make sure all parts are included. If any part is missing or damaged, please contact us.
- 3. All parts must be used as indicated in these instructions. Do not substitute any parts, leave parts out, or use any parts that are worn out or broken.
- 4. Do not disassemble the main body, as it has been installed & commissioned correctly & precisely before leaving the factory.
- 5. **IMPORTANT**: Turn off the main power at the circuit breaker and place the wall switch or pull chain in the "OFF" position.
- 6. Do not use bulbs with wattage greater than specified on this fixture.





### **Installation Guide**









 $\begin{tabular}{ll} 1. Shut off power before installation. Fix \\ the mounting strap (A) to ceiling. \\ \end{tabular}$ 

2. Screw in light bulb (B). Then screw on the globe shade (C) to the lamp holder (D).

Connect the wires with wire connectors (E) to the corresponding wires in ceiling.



4. Attach the canopy (F) to mounting strap (A) and fix with cap nuts (G).



5. Turn on the power and test.

## **Troubleshooting**
